A PROCLAMATION

WHEREAS it is enacted by section 5 of the Public Holidays Act (Chapter 23:23) that it shall be lawful for the Governor-General on the advice of the Cabinet to issue a Proclamation appointing a special day or part of a day to be reserved as a public holiday throughout Saint Christopher and Nevis or in any island, town, district or village thereof

AND WHEREAS the Governor-General on the advice of the Cabinet of Saint Christopher and Nevis considers it expedient that Thursday the 2nd day of January, 2020 should be observed and kept as a public holiday in Saint Christopher and Nevis on the occasion of the 2019/2020 Carnival

NOW, THEREFORE, I, SIR SAMUEL WEYMOUTH TAPLEY SEATON, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Commander of the Royal Victorian Order, Queen's Counsel, Justice of the Peace, Doctors of Laws Governor-General of the Federation of Saint Christopher and Nevis, do with the advice of the Cabinet, in exercise of the powers conferred on me by the said section of the said Act, appoint Thursday the 2nd day of January, 2020 to be reserved and kept as a public holiday in Saint Christopher and Nevis

AND all our officers and loving subjects in Saint Christopher and Nevis and all others whom it may concern are hereby required to take due notice hereof and to give their ready obedience accordingly.

GIVEN under my hand and the Public Seal of Saint Christopher and Nevis at Government House Saint Christopher this 23rd day of December 2019, and in the sixty-eighth year of Her Majesty's reign.
